

Bartlett Farm Tours

The Bartlett Farm is full of action all year 'round. Baby chicks, pigs, hogs, goat kids, billy goats, calves, laying hens, bees and horses are a great blessing to watch, but they can also be delicate, easily frightened or otherwise become out of control.

There are a host of mechanical and biological factors that we manage in order to grow great tasting, pure food without chemicals or antibiotics. So when you visit, please observe the following rules. By doing so, you will help us stay on our production schedule and enjoy our time with you.

BARTLETT FARM TOUR RULES

1. Farm tours are generally scheduled on Thursdays from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m., April 1st through October 31st. Our farm changes each season, so you might want to visit more than once a year. Please call at least two weeks ahead to schedule a tour.
2. Stay with the tour guide. With larger groups, the tour guide will ask you to break up into smaller groups to better observe some areas of the farm.
3. Our house is under construction, so please plan to use a restroom before arriving or plan to use the outhouse. Our private bathroom will be available for emergencies.
4. Keep your children under control so they don't become injured, disturb the animals, trample plants, or cause damage. Electric fences are usually active!
5. Stay out of the house, buildings, and gardens unless invited and joined by one of the Bartletts.
6. Ask before you touch or move anything.
7. Depending on what is happening in the kitchen that day, we may be able to give you a taste of something good from the farm.
8. If there are any additional rules needed at the time of the tour, we will let you know upon arrival.
